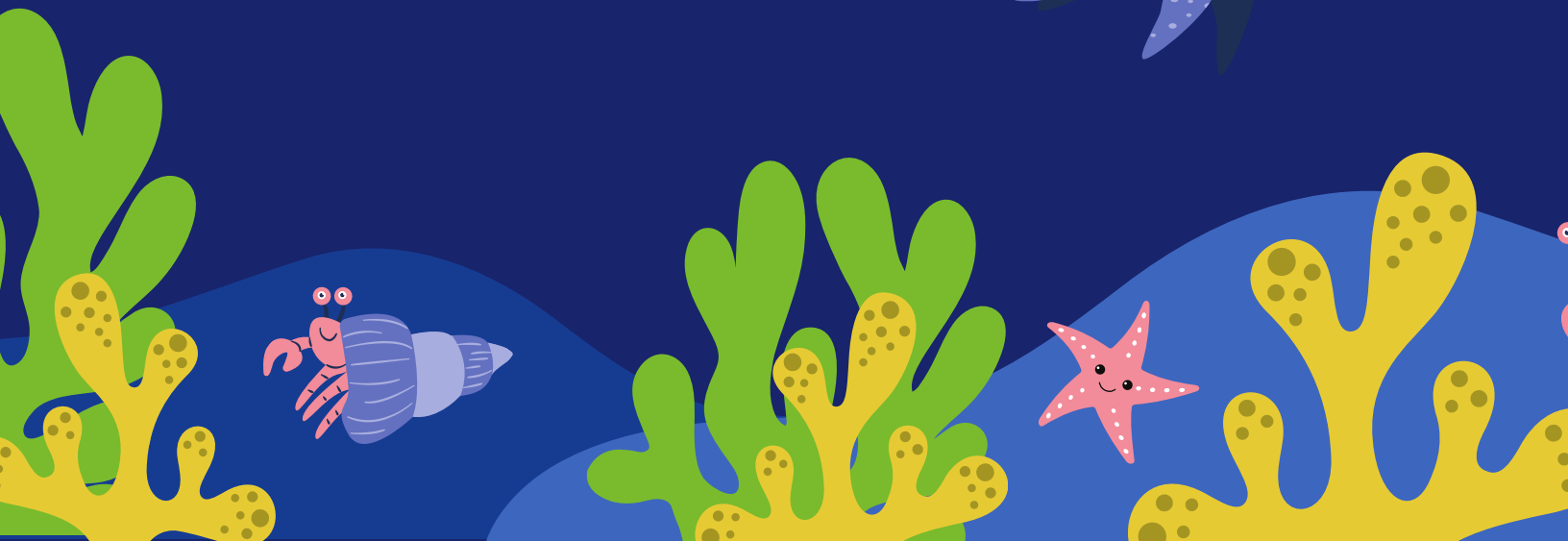
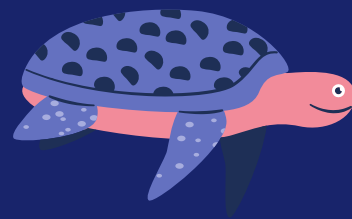

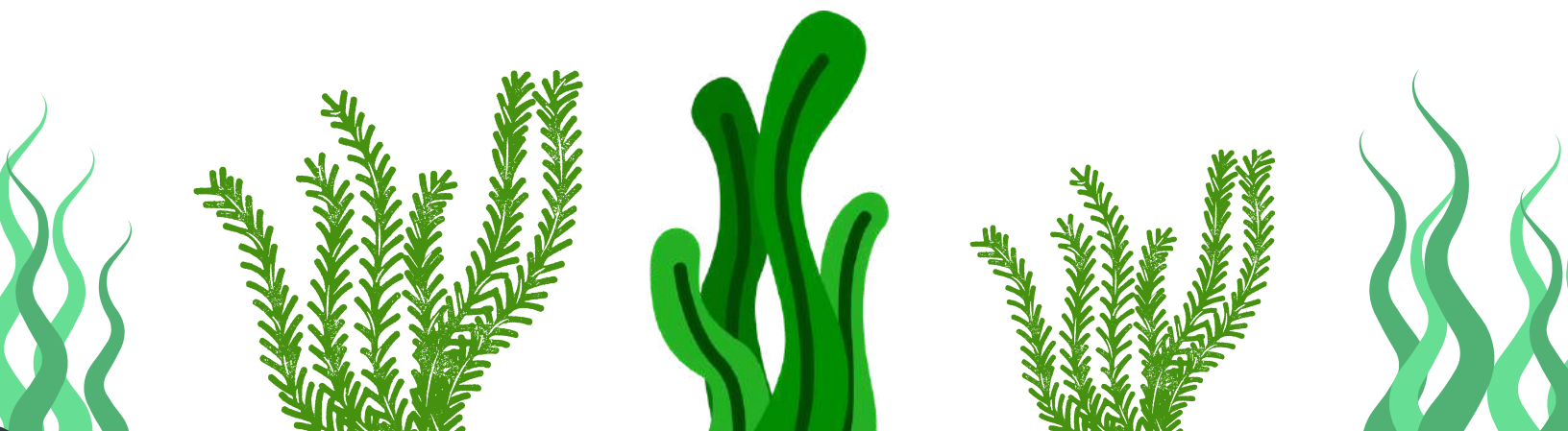
- **Tuesday, June 14: Where is Waldo?:** Learn about camouflage and try to make your clay octopus blend into different sea environments.

How the program works: Getting ready for school isn't just about being ready academically but socially and emotionally as well. This program supports and encourages caregivers to share 1,000 learning experiences before kindergarten. The five early literacy practices (read, talk, write, play, and sing) work together to help kids understand how words sound, what letters look like, and how to link words to images or objects.

Getting started: We'll be kicking off the program at our final SLP party on July 31. Come sign up your child (ages 0-5)! You'll get a program booklet and your child will get to join the "frog pond" where they can track their progress as they continue the program. As they move from one level to another, they'll receive prize and will progress through the different levels of frog development, from an egg to a fully formed frog.

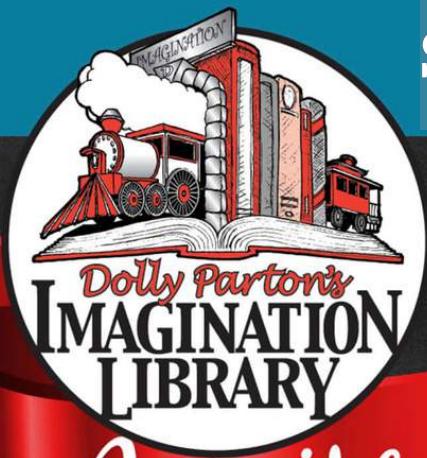
